


The proposal



The details

Apart from that we just wanted to make sure we had a very relaxed day. My bouquet was in shades of creams and blues. I had a lot of gypsophila, which I think is beautiful and very simple. For our cake we had a single tiered cake. Our family don't eat much cake, so it was more symbolic.

The ceremony

Our wedding ceremony took place on Anfi Del Mar's beautiful Heart Shaped Island in Gran Canaria. It's nestled between a white Caribbean-style sandy beach and a quaint harbour. It's just the most amazing setting. The ceremony lasted around 15 minutes; It wasn't a religious ceremony so we wanted something short and sweet. The reception

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

Marry in the Canary Islands

One of the best reasons for marrying in the Canary Islands is the fantastic climate, considered to be one of the best in the world, with an average year-round temperature of 18-24°C and cloudless skies almost guaranteed. Legals

A wedding ceremony in the Canary Islands is guaranteed to be a beautiful occasion. However, because the Canary Islands follow Spanish law, marriage of foreigners, including UK citizens, is not currently legal. But don't let that put you off. You can still take advantage of having a beautiful blessing ceremony, without having to worry about applying for a Marriage License, having the correct documents and getting them translated. We recommend that you apply to marry in the UK with a civil wedding at your local registry office before you leave for your blessing. You are then free to travel to the Canary Islands and enjoy a totally romantic symbolic wedding ceremony.

In the case of Catholic ceremonies, the wedding ceremony in the Canary Islands is legally binding regardless of the nationality of the parties. Once the church in the Islands has been chosen, and a date set with the priest, the only thing left to do is ask the corresponding diosesis for the parties' documents, a process, which takes about a month.

Wedding planning

It is a good idea to hire the service of a professional wedding planner to take care of every detail. Top 5 Things to do

Spot whales and dolphins

Be amazed by dolphins and whales swimming up close when you take a whale watching boat excursion



in the Canary Islands. The strait dividing Tenerife and La Gomera is populated with one of the most important colonies of pilot whales on the planet.

Visit Teide National Park

On an awesome up-hill road trip you will climb high above the cloud layer to Teide National Park, a

Go Stargazing
With low light pollution and high altitude, the Canary
Islands offer some of the best locations for stargazing

boasts one of the most important solar observatories on the planet, or visit the modern observatory in the mountains of the Roque de los Muchachos in La Palma.

Walk in the Dunes

Visit the spectacular Dunes of Maspalomas in Gran Canaria – a Natural Reserve since 1897, which is an important landmark of Gran Canaria. Gaze in awe at the amazing formation of sand dunes as far as the eye can see, then take a stroll with sand between your toes.

Admire the savin Junipers

Be sure to take a trip to El Sabinar on the island of El
Hierro to see the stunning sight of the savin juniper
trees, which the strong and constant north-easterly
winds have moulded into incredible shapes.
